


# What's so complicated?

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## Image vs. Canvas

- · Canvas: Your work area
- · Image: Your paint
- Only Difference
  - Mouse vs. Brush





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# Scanning and Cropping

- · Not everything is digital
- · Resolution matters

• 32dpi





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# Exercise 1 – Scanning

### Mac:

- Open Epson Scan>Preview>Scan
- · File>Save to Desktop
- Right-Click Image>Open With>Adobe Photoshop CS5

### Windows:

- · Open Photoshop, File>Import>EPSON Scanner
- Preview>Scan>Close Epson Dialog Box



## Exercise 2 – Cropping

- · Select and Paste Method
  - Select the Rectangular Marquee Tool
  - · Drag the crosshair to select each image
  - Edit>Copy
  - File>New, Edit>Paste



- » Note: Size of the canvas is automatically populated
- Crop Tool Method
  - Select the Crop Tool
  - Drag the crosshair over what you want
  - Commit your change



# Exercise 3 – Image Rotation

- Select the Untitled tab
- From the toolbar, select Image>Image Rotation>90°



- · Rotation by Hand:
  - 1st: Select the object using the Rectangular Marque Tool
  - 2nd: Select the Move Tool and rotate



# Exercise 4 — Resizing Images • From the toolbar, select Image, Image Size • Width: ~1024px • Height: ~1546px The control of the Folder of

# Resizing Images Cont. Resizing Images via the Move Tool: • Select the Move Tool, check show transformation controls Trimming: • Removes excess canvas • Image>Trim...

# Exercise 5 – Adding and Manipulating Text • Select the Horizontal Text Tool • Using the cross hairs, select the area at the top of the image. • Font: Myraid Pro, Regular, 12pt, Sharp • Add some text "Martial Arts Lickey" • Using the warp text feature • Style: Arc • Bend: 18%

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### Exercise 6 – Brightening & Color Correction

 Copy the Photoshop CS5 folder to your desktop from the Shared Folder

### **Brightening Images**

- · Use Image 2 from the Shared Folder
- · Image>Adjustments>Brightness/Contrast

· Image>Adjustments>Curves

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# Exercise 7 – Magic Wand and Paint Bucket

• Everyone stand up raise their wands and repeat after me.


### Wait that's a mouse not a wand...

- · Change our image from cloudy to sunny
  - Select the magic wand tool
  - · While holding down shift, select the sky
  - Sky Color: a6ddff

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# Exercise 8 - Content Aware Remove the windows from our building Content Aware Exercise Using the rectangular marque tool select the right top window Press Fn + Delete (Delete on Std Keyboard) Fill Dialog should appear, Click OK





## **Layer Masks**

- Used to mask portions of an image without modifying the original
- Like the eraser tool but doesn't damage the original image
- Best used for blending images together



## Exercise 10 - Layer Masking

- Accent items in our black and white image
  - Open the layer\_mask image from the shared folder
  - · Duplicate the initial layer
    - Layer>Duplicate Layer
       Name: Masked Layer
  - Create your mask
    - Select the Masked Layer
    - Apply a layer mask via the layer mask button



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## Layer Mask Cont.

- Transform our masked\_layer to black and white
  - Insure the masked layer is selected
  - Select the Image
  - Image>Adjustments>Black & White
  - Select the layer mask
  - Paint the mask with black to reveal the colored layer beneath it

# Exercise 11 - Sharpening

- A touchy subject
- Best on the small stuff
- Too much is too much...
- Open blurred\_image from the Exercise folder
- Filter>Sharpen
